AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL: AIC placed sixth overall and first among NCAA Division II teams at the 2009 New England Intercollegiate Golf Association (NEIGA) Championship at the par-72 Captains Golf Club with a team score of 606 (305-301). Junior Garrett Beyor tied for third overall with a one-under par 143 (72-71). Sophomore Kevin Daniels tied for 26th with a 10-over par 152 (78-74) and junior Kent Graham tied for 45th with a 14-over par 156 (77-79). Freshman Nate Pereira tied for 73rd with a 159 (82-77) and junior Greg Strattner tied for 79th with a 160 (78-82).



ASSUMPTION: The Greyhounds finished 18th overall in the recent NEIGA event however third among Division II institutions. Junior Ryan Myers (Foxboro, Mass.) was the medalist for the team at 76-79--155, while junior Rick Bylund had the best round, a 74, on the second day of competition.



BENTLEY: At the New Englands, Bentley finished sixth amongst Division II teams and 22nd overall, with junior Alex Macielak (Saratoga Springs, N.Y.) and senior Brian Jasset (Norwood, Mass.) leading the way. Macielak tied for 73rd (79-80-159) and Jasset tied for 79th (81-79-160). During Monday's skill competition, Macielak captured the bunker contest. Jasset and Macielak finished the fall portion of the schedule with Bentley's best stroke averages, 78.0 and 78.4, respectively.



SAINT MICHAEL'S: Saint Michael's finished 30th at the NEIGA Championship on Monday and Tuesday. The Purple Knights were in 32nd place after Monday's first round before moving up two spots on Tuesday. Last season, Saint Michael's was also 32nd after day one before finishing in a tie for 29th. Three Purple Knights shot 81 or lower in Tuesday's final round, led by junior Mark Mitchell (Wilbraham, Mass.), who carded an 80 on Tuesday and a 162 for the tournament, finishing in a tie for 92nd place.



SAINT ROSE: The Golden Knights concluded the fall portion of their 2009-10 campaign by winning their own Fall Shootout via a tie-breaker over Le Moyne College at the par-72; 6,957-yard Colonie Golf and Country Club Thursday afternoon. Saint Rose and Dolphins each finished with a team score of 329. However, the fifth score in the Golden Knights' lineup was one stroke better than Le Moyne's, thus allowing the Saint Rose to capture the team title in the first year of what will become an annual fall event. Sophomore Matt Horton put the finishing touches on a stellar fall slate by carding a two-over 74 to take home medalist honors. It marked the third time in his career Horton turned in the top individual score to win an event.



SOUTHERN NEW HAMPSHIRE: Southern New Hampshire finished third among Division II schools and 16th out of 39 teams competing at the NEIGA Championship Monday and Tuesday. Junior D.J. Lantz (New London, N.H.) finished second among Division II players and tied for 19th overall with a two-day score of 150.

Adelphi Wins First-Ever NE-10 Golf Championship

Bernardston, Mass. – Adelphi University claimed the 2009 Northeast-10 Men's Golf Championship after shooting a two-day total of 620 at the Crumpin-Fox Golf Club in Bernardston, Mass. Adelphi will receive the automatic qualifying bid to the NCAA Championship this spring. The Panthers are in their first year of competition as a member of the Northeast-10.

Southern New Hampshire's **Shane Winslow (Portsmouth, N.H.)** earned medalist honors after defeating Adelphi's **Stuart Pulkinen (Toronto, Canada)** in a three-hole playoff. Both players shot par on the 10th hole (par-4) and the 11th hole (par-3) before Winslow shot par-4 on the 12th hole, while Pulkinen recorded a seven. Both players finished the two-day tournament with a score of 150. Winslow finished with a 78 on day two after shooting a tournament low 72 for par on day one.

Winslow became the first Penmen to win the Gordon McCullough Memorial Award (medalist) since Jeff Sullivan (2003). The Gordon McCullough Memorial Award was named for the late coach, a long-time member of the Univ. of Hartford Athletics program. McCullough was inducted into the Northeast-10 Inaugural Hall of Fame Class in 2006.

The College of Saint Rose's **Matt Horton (Troy, N.Y.)** finished in a tie for third with Southern New Hampshire's D.J. Lantz (New London, N.H.) pulling in a two-day score of 151. American International's **Greg Strattner (Westfield, Mass.)** rounded out the top-five after recording a two-day score of 153 (75-78).

Other individual honors went to American International's Colin Dansereau (Ludlow, Mass.) who was the top freshman finisher after shooting 75-80—155 to earn Freshman of the Year honors. Adelphi head coach Tim McAleer received Coach of the Year accolades.

American International as a team finished in second place with a total score of 623 as the Yellow Jackets recorded their highest ever finish in program history in the Northeast-10 Championship. Southern New Hampshire followed with a third place finish after shooting a two-day total of 632 as the Penmen closely edged out Le Moyne College by two strokes (634). Bentley University rounds out the top five with a score of 640.

The remaining team finishes are as follows with Saint Anselm College finishing in sixth place (641) followed by the University of Massachusetts Lowell with a score of 643. Pace University finished eighth with a score of 645 followed by Franklin Pierce University in ninth (656) and Assumption College in tenth (664), while Saint Michael's College and the College of Saint Rose finished with scores of 670 and 678 respectively.

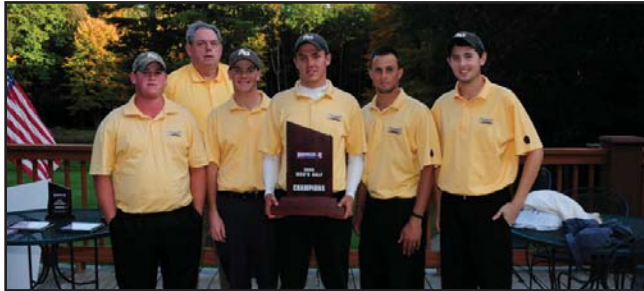
With 16 member institutions the Northeast-10 shares the distinction of being the largest Division II conference in the country along with the PSAC and WVIAC. Its 23 championship sports provide athletic opportunities for over 5,500 student-athletes, the largest such program of any Division II conference.
