2009 NORTHEAST-10 CROSS COUNTRY WEEKLY INFORMATION



ADELPHI: The Adelphi University cross-country program was off last weekend but will return to action on Friday, October 2 at the Paul Short Run in Lehigh, Pennsylvania. The Panther women achieved a program first last week when the USTFCCA ranked Adelphi #25 in the country, the first such honor in program history. The men also moved up the regional rankings, sliding into the third spot behind Stonehill and Umass-Lowell. The women trail only #22 Stonehill in the regional rankings.



AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL: AIC's women's cross country team placed fifth of five teams at Central Connecticut State's Ted Owens Invitational. The Yellow Jackets were the only non-Division I school at the meet. Sophomore Julie Collignon placed third overall with a time of 18:29.09, tying her own school record that she set last week. Senior Malcolm Forbes finished 31st with a time of 29:48.55 to lead the men's squad.



ASSUMPTION: Sophomore Kyle Higgins (Braintree, Mass.) was the Greyhounds top performer as the team finished third in the Worcester City Championship, while sophomore Kelsey Baltzell (Sutton, Mass.) and sophomore Erynn Sweeney (Braintree, Mass.) were both in the top 10 for the women who also finished third.



BENTLEY: In the Codfish Bowl, the Bentley men finished third amongst 18 teams, trailing only the Greater Boston Track Club and the Boston Athletic Association, and the Falcon women were fifth of 23. Bentley's top runners were junior Lauren Lesniak (Dracut, Mass.), 20th of 207 with a time of 19:30.8 for 5,000 meters, and senior Steve Bergantino (Guilford, Conn.), 15th of 202 in 26:06.7 (8,000 meters). The Falcons are now off until the New England's Oct. 10.



UMASS LOWELL: Only 25 seconds separated UMass Lowell's top five runners as it captured the team championship at the Williams College Purple Valley Classic. Junior Angus MacDonald led the way in fifth place with a time of 24:54 while senior Tim Guerin placed sixth in 26:01. The UMass Lowell women captured the Williams College Purple Valley Classic, placing five freshmen runners in the top nine places, led by Kelly Walton (20:15), who placed second, and Gina Butler (20:16), who took third.



MERRIMACK: MEN: The men's team finished 11th out of 23 teams and second among Northeast-10 schools at the Codfish Bowl Invite. Running well for the men were freshman John Lawrence 40th-26:56, freshman Harry Mullin 44th-27:02, and sophomore John Doherty 70th- 27:35. **WOMEN:** The women's team finished 9th out of 18 teams and second among Northeast-10 schools at the Codfish Bowl Invite. Running well for the women were senior Katie Meagher 36th-20:10, freshman Christina Fisher 52nd-20:33, and senior Jen Richard 63rd- 20:43.



NEW HAVEN: The University of New Haven cross country teams competed at the 33rd Annual Father Leeber S.J. Invitational Saturday morning. The men finished tied for seventh place, out of nine teams, while the women grabbed a fifth place finish, of nine teams. The UNH men's and women's cross country teams return to action at the All-New England Championships in Boston, Mass. on Saturday, October 10.



PACE: Freshman Brianna Cano (Franklin Square, N.Y.) led the Setters to an 11th place finish at the Connecticut College invitational. Cano finished in 14th place with a time of 23:22.



SAINT ANSELM: Saint Anselm traveled to the Connecticut College Invitational this past weekend, where the women placed ninth and the men finished in 16th. Jessica St. Laurent led the Hawks with a 36th-place finish as she finished in a time of 24:20, a pace of 6:32 per mile. This is the second straight meet she has been the top Saint Anselm finisher. Drew Matthews was the top Saint Anselm men's runner in a time of 31:06. Both teams return to action on Saturday at the Pop Crowell Invitational, hosted by Gordon College.



SAINT MICHAEL'S: The Purple Knights cross country team had 41 runners come out for the Purple & Gold race they hosted on Saturday. The men's team had four athletes run the 5K course in under 20 minutes, claiming the fastest times of the day. Sophomore Matt Smith came in at 18:22, 52 seconds ahead of sophomore Tom Perekslis who finished second at 19:14. Sophomore Brian McDonnell finished third at 19:17, followed by freshman Nathan Buck at 19:24. Freshman Julie Saliy was the first member of the women's team to finish, coming in 12th with a time of 21:40.



SAINT ROSE: The Golden Knights are ranked #7 in the men's USTFCCA East Regional Poll. Saint Rose has won three consecutive team titles to start the year, while sophomore Macky Lloyd established the second fastest 8k time in school history at the Shacklette Invitational on Saturday, September 19. Meanwhile, the women's squad is ranked #6 in the USTFCCA East Regional Poll.



SOUTHERN CONNECTICUT: MEN: On Saturday, the Owls finished fifth overall in the 16-team field at the Connecticut College Invitational with 153 points. Junior Joseph Poulsen led the squad with a time of 25:20. He finished second overall in the meet. **WOMEN:** The Owls notched two top-10 finishes this weekend at the Connecticut College Invitational. Senior Laura Brustolon won the meet as she set a new course record with a time of 21:49. Freshman Kelsey Proctor placed ninth as she finished in 23:08. Southern finished sixth overall in the 15-team field with 163 points. Both squads return to action on October 10th for the New England Championships.

SOUTHERN NEW HAMPSHIRE: Sophomore Emma Lundberg (Hebron, N.H.) posted the second-fast time in program history with her 19:42 effort at the Codfish Bowl on Saturday, one week after setting a school record at the UMass Dartmouth Invitational. She now owns five of the top six 5K times

in program history.



STONEHILL: MEN: The Skyhawks moved up one slot to No. 12 in last week's USTFCCA Division II National poll and remained the top ranked team in the organization's East Regional rankings. Stonehill captured the team title at the Pre-National Invitational hosted by the University of Southern Indiana on Saturday, led by fifth-place finisher junior Patrick Fullerton (Bradford, Mass.). The Skyhawks placed four runners in the top ten, had all five scoring runners in the top 13 and put all seven runners in the top 25. Stonehill's top five runners all finished within one minute of each other and all seven finished in a 90-second span. The Skyhawks defeated three other nationally-ranked programs in #9 Southern Indiana (2nd), #24 Harding University (3rd) and #5 Abilene Christian (4th). Junior captain Daniel Pilz (Newington, Conn.) followed Fullerton by ten seconds for sixth overall (25:34.84), while senior Joshua Andrews (Chelmsford, Mass.) was eighth (25:53.31) and sophomore Stephen Polito (Worcester, Mass.) was tenth (26:05.36). **WOMEN:** Stonehill is ranked 22nd in last week's USTFCCA Division II National poll and remained the organization's top-ranked team in the East Region. The Skyhawks turned in a fourth place finish at Saturday's Pre-National Invitational, hosted by the University of Southern Indiana. Stonehill finished behind #13 University of Tampa, #11 Southern Indiana and #23 Ferris State University and ahead of #21 Harding University. Sophomore Jill Alves (Whitman, Mass.) led the Skyhawks with a 15th-place finish (out of 75) with a time of 23:23.92 over the 6K course which will host the NCAA Division II Championships in November. Freshmen Lynley Joynt (Guilderland, N.Y.) and Kristen Veit (Easthampton, Mass.) also recorded top-20 finishes. Junior Lindsay Booth (Franklin, Mass.) placed 22nd overall with a personal-best time of 23:52.01.
